Reflection John 20:11-16

¹¹ But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb, and as she wept she stooped to look into the tomb. ¹² And she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had lain, one at the head and one at the feet. ¹³ They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." ¹⁴ Having said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. ¹⁵ Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned and said to him in Aramaic "Rabboni!" (which means Teacher).

At first sight, the story of Mary Magdalene in the garden is rather puzzling. How is it, having been told Jesus has risen, and then seeing him face to face, she doesn't realise who he is? Yet is that really so strange?

She'd watched as he drew his last breath on the cross, she'd seen him carried limp and lifeless into the tomb, she'd witnessed the stone being placed over the tomb entrance, and understandably, she was convinced that it was all over, his life irrevocably extinguished. Anybody who has faced apparent finality of the death of a loved one will understand those feelings.

Yet slowly the truth dawned from that ending had come a new beginning not just for Jesus but for her and everyone. Joy, hope, purpose, love, which had all been buried with Jesus in the tomb, came leaping back to life; the future that a moment before had seemed so empty was suddenly brimming over with promise. That is the truth of resurrection not just for Mary, but also for us all. It does not only speak of life beyond the grave; it tells us that from what looks the bleakest of endings God is able to bring new beginnings beyond our wildest dreams.

Prayer

Lord Jesus Christ, teach me, however hopeless circumstances might seem, however much I may feel myself at a dead end, never to lose my sense of all that you are able to do. Remind me that endings can lead to new beginnings, and that new life can spring from the old, and in that confidence may I look forward to everything you will yet do within me.

'16 to 25+ year olds'

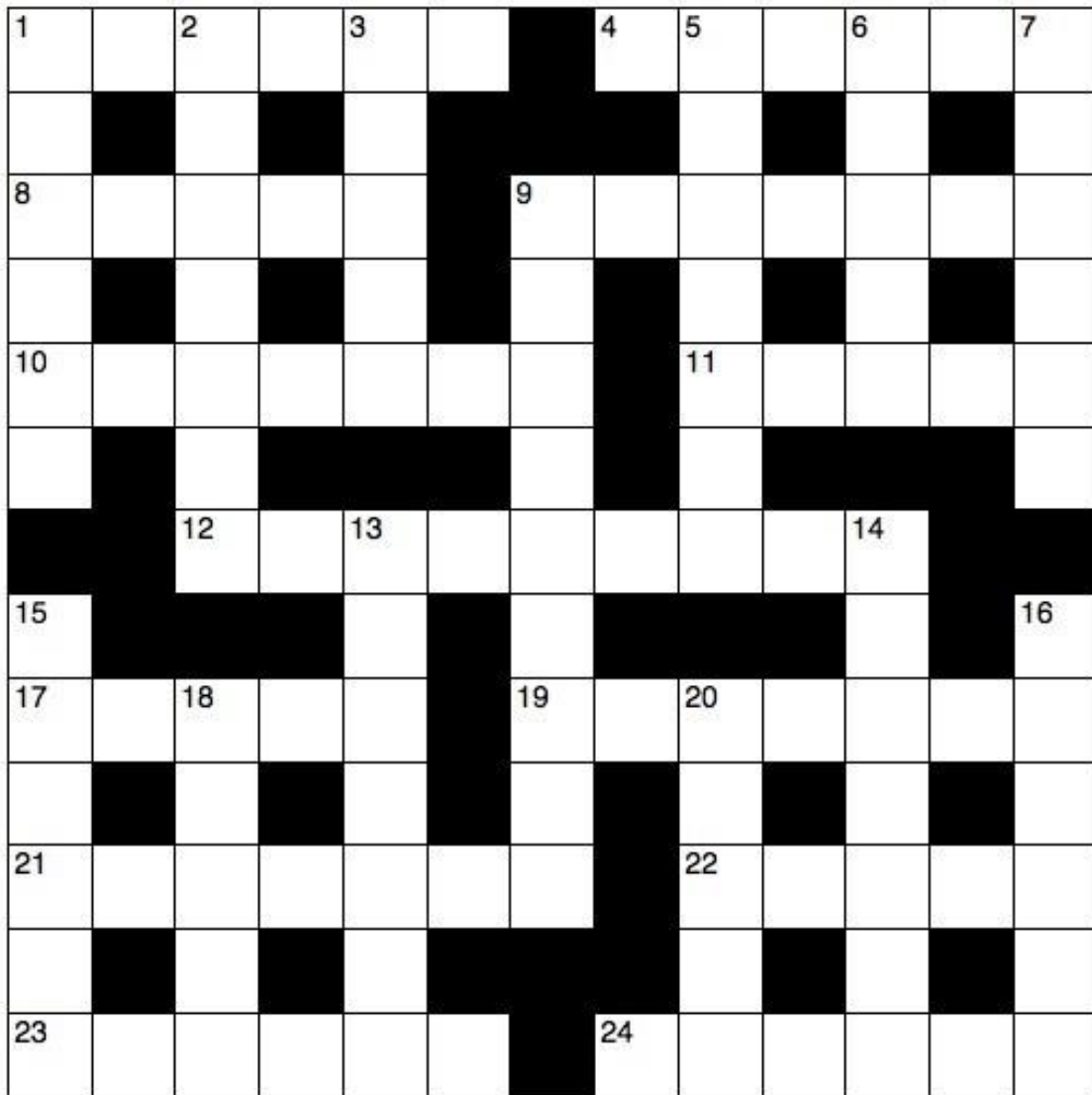

Reflection – Psalm 139:7-10

⁷ Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? ⁸ If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. ⁹ If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, ¹⁰ even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.

‘We seek him there, we seek him there, those Frenchies seek him everywhere. Is he in heaven? – Is he in hell? That demmed elusive Pimpernel?’ So run the famous lines of Baroness Orczy concerning the renowned character of her novels: the so-called Scarlet Pimpernel. Come what may, the dashing hero invariably turns up at the right time and in the right place; no one and nowhere, it seems, is beyond his reach. Such of course, is the prerogative of fictional heroes.

With God, though, it is no fiction. He is the one before and beyond all, yet the one who is with us, here and now; the ruler over space and time, yet the one constantly by our side. No-one is outside his love, nowhere beyond his grace, no situation outside his concern – not even death itself can separate us from his sovereign purpose in Christ. Whether you see him or whether you don’t, whether you sense he is close or feel he is far away, remember this: he is here, there and everywhere.

Prayer Almighty God, you are higher than my highest thoughts, yet always close by my side. Thank you for the truth, and for the knowledge that though I wander far from you, always you seek me out. Though you may seem distant, always you are near. Help me to live each day in that assurance. Amen.

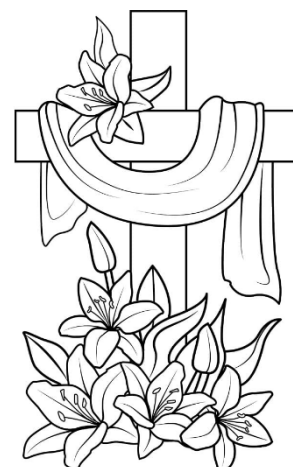
