

Dear Friends

Though it hasn't arrived as I write this, it will have by the time you read it – welcome to the Season of Advent!

Again in our Advent services this year we will spend time preparing ourselves to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

And again, before too long, you will get a leaflet through your door with the details of the Christmas services for all the churches in our villages. As well as the Sunday services, there will be Christmas Eve services in both our churches again this year. At the Christmas Eve Family service at Polbeth Harwood, again we would like to invite children aged around eight and under to come dressed as Mary, Joseph, the donkey, the innkeeper, shepherds,



angels, wise men, kings and the star and join in the Nativity story with us. And of course, there will be the Christmas Eve Watch-night Service at the West Kirk with candles, carols, readings, and drama.

After the success of our united services the last couple of years we will be gathering in each other's churches for united services on the last Sunday of this year and the first Sunday of 2008. Please see the details of services in this issue of The Link. Of course, you are very welcome to any or all of our services over this festive season!

To help prepare for Advent, I've included a piece by Dietrich Bonhoeffer for you to read, called 'This reversal of all things:'



If we want to be part of these events, Advent and Christmas, we cannot just sit there like a theatre audience and enjoy all the lovely pictures. Instead, we ourselves will be caught up in this action, this reversal of all things; we must become actors on this stage. For this is a play in which each spectator has a part to play, and we cannot hold back.

What will our role be? Worshipful shepherds bending the knee, or kings bringing gifts? What

is being enacted when Mary becomes the mother of God, when God enters the world in a lowly manger?

We cannot come to this manger in the same way we would approach the cradle of any other child. Something will happen to each one of us who decides to come to Christ's manger. Each of us will have been judged or redeemed before we go away. Each of us will either break down, or come to know that God's mercy is turned toward us ... What does it mean to say such things about the Christ child? ... It is God, the Lord and Creator of all things, who becomes so small here, comes to us in a little corner of the world, unremarkable and hidden away, who wants to meet us and be among us as a helpless, defenceless child.

The Christmas Candy Bar, by now, will be a memory – hopefully a good one!




The Group wishes all our friends and regulars a very happy Christmas and a good New Year.

There was an anxious pause, before the little girl asked, "Did they die in the morning services or the evening services?"


West Kirk Guild Report

Green Tip



A Word From Cheeky Monkey

We went, we saw, we puppeted!

We were very impressed with the standard of performance shown by teams of puppeteers who had travelled to compete and perform from places ranging from Peterhead to Gateshead. Many of the teams were young people from churches and youth groups. Their puppets sang, danced, rapped, played the saxophone or even the drums, and presented stories like The Bus Stop Samaritan and The Prodigal Bart. The audience were enthusiastic participants too, probably because most of us know what it is like to be up there at the front looking for a reaction! The whole day was great fun for people and puppets alike.



Most of the performances were done with the puppets held overhead and the puppeteers behind a stage with very impressive backdrops, sound effects and music. This was rather daunting to a humble monkey like myself but the workshops gave some very useful tips on working with all sorts of puppets to get a message across. The team of tutors were expert performers with years of experience and in some cases even ventriloquist or magic skills.

The aim of the whole event was to equip and inform people to use their puppets and the skills God has given them to do His work. It was stressed that we don't do it to look good (that comes as a by-product when the monkey's so handsome), but to serve God and bring His good news to people in entertaining and non-threatening ways. The advice given was very practical and of instant use. For example, if working solo, rehearse in front of the bedroom mirror, but close the curtains first to avoid concerning your neighbours!

Aileen and I were brave enough to enter a lip-synching competition - we didn't win but it was fun to be up and having a go at singing along to the music. Not sure we'll be using that technique in church soon but you never know....


