



Sunday Morning Worship takes place at The West Kirk at 9.30 am and at Polbeth Harwood at 11.15 am each Sunday.

Gift Aid

Gift Aid allows individuals who are subject to UK income tax, to complete a simple, short declaration that they are a UK taxpayer. Any cash donations that the taxpayer makes to the charity after making a declaration are treated as being made after deduction of income tax at the basic rate, and the charity can reclaim the basic rate income tax paid on the gift from HMRC. For a basic-rate taxpayer, this adds approximately 28% to the value of any gift made under Gift Aid. Higher-rate

taxpayers can claim income tax relief, above and beyond the amount claimed directly by the charities.

Without increasing your offering you can substantially increase church funds. Recently over £3000 in Gift Aid has been reclaimed from HMRC.



The Church of Scotland Ministries and Mission Contributions 2010

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

Thenk you for supporting the worthip, mission and service of the Church through the money you give in your offering. It is important that you know what happens to this money. This letter tells you about your congregation's Ministries and Mission Centribution - the money your Congregational Treasurer sends to the Church Offices in in Edinburgh. How does it enable the worship, mission and service of the Church?

The information below shows how the contributions from your finked congregations are used to support Parish Ministries. Mission and Renewal, and general support and services provided for congregations and the councils of the General Assembly. Please note that the cost of your minister is not what halane is paid. This cost is the total for stipend and employer's national insurance and pension contributions, and is based on a minister with ten years' service.

This supports the Church's work in resourcing congregations for Christian education and outreach, in caring for the vulnerable in society, in partnership with Churches in some of the poorest parts of the world, and in providing a Christian perspective on the social, political and moral issues of today.

Support and Services for Councils and Congregations (7.5%)

£3,794

This provides financial, legal, procedural, safeguarding and other services, and meets the cost of the General Assembly and the Moderator.

Please note that Ministries and Mission Contributions only provide part of the total funding required for the work of the Church lieted above. A fuller picture is given in the leaflet Funding our Faith, which is available free to all congregations.

I hope that this helps you to understand Ministries and Mission Contributions and shows you are enabling the sharing of the gospel through the money your congregation sends through the Church Offices to all parts of Scotland and beyond.

Malawi "Rice Challenge"

In Malawi, which you may remember used to be called Nyasaland, as little as one in three children are able to attend High School. However, we now have the opportunity to help fund a child for one year of High School and make a big difference to young lives in one of the poorest countries in Africa.

For, as we all know, it is education that lifts us out of poverty and equips any society with the teachers, doctors, nurses and workers. And this is how it can be done. If a farmer in Malawi can sell 90 kg of rice at a fair price, then he would have sufficient income to send one of his children to High School. We have purchased 90×1 kg bags of rice which we are offering for sale. The cost of a bag is £2.50.

Over one hundred groups took the rice challenge earlier this year and the first batch of rice of nearly seventeen tonnes completely sold out. The rice is on sale at both the West Kirk and Polbeth Harwood churches. If you cannot come to church but would like a bag delivered to your home please let us know.
